Nursery [©] this week we have been thinking about the number 3. We found out that a triangle has 3 sides.






This week we started reading 'Handa's surprise'. We tasted the different foods from the story- we all learned that we like avocado.









This week we have been writing instructions about how to catch a star. We have been focusing on the presentation of our work, making sure our letters are the correct size and height.

In science we have continued to find out about materials. We looked at materials that are waterproof and which ones are the best to keep things dry.








Year 2

In English we have been planning diary entries from the perspective of Rapunzel.


In maths we have been learning the 2 times table.


Year 4

In art, children finished their painting inspired by Claude Monet and Neil Dawson.













In writing, we have wrote some fantastic retelling of the story Beowulf from Grendel's point of view.
