PSHE(Personal Social Health and Economic Education).

Intent

At Farnham it is our intent for all our pupils to reflect PSHE through the school's aims and ethos at all times. We see PSHE as the personal, emotional, social and mental well-being of everyone in a caring and safe environment where all are encouraged to feel good about themselves and have respect for each other. Teaching and learning enables pupils to become healthy, independent and responsible members of society.

We encourage our pupils to play a positive role in contribution to the life of the school and the wider community. In doing so, we help develop their sense of self worth.

.Implementation

We implement this by teaching them how society is organised and governed. We ensure that they experience the process of democracy in school through the School Council. We teach them about rights and responsibilities. We are aware of the way that PSHE supports many of the principles of safeguarding and links closely to schools Safeguarding, SMSC and British Value policies. They learn to appreciate what it means to be a positive member of a diverse multicultural society.

From EYFS to Year 6, children are taught PSHE following a spiral curriculum with half-termly whole school themes taught by the class teacher in the first week of each half-term.

These themes are:

Autumn 1: Belonging

Autumn 2: Keeping Safe

Spring 1: Getting On and Falling Out

Spring 2: Money and work

Summer 1: Healthy Lifestyles and Healthy mind

Summer 2: Healthy Relationships and growing up.

EYFS have their own spiral curriculum: Personal, Social and Emotional development, Physical development and Understanding the world.

These themes are reinforced as an integral part of the Creative Curriculum, class assemblies and weekly Key Stage assemblies throughout the term. We have a display board of children's work in the hall which follows the current PSHE theme. There is a weekly timetabled session for circle time in each class, which class teachers will use to support our PSHE teaching.

Throughout the year, we also have a range of visits and visitors which contribute to the children's learning in PSHE. Our whole PSHE curriculum gives children confidence and self esteem, whilst teaching them how to be healthy and manage risk.
