



In maths we have been learning how to divide by 2 and 10!


In English we have learnt about statements, questions, commands and exclamations this week!





Year 4




In maths, we have continued our work on perimeter. We looked at the perimeter of polygons and learnt about regular and irregular polygons.




In reading, year 5 have produced some wonderful illustrations of Father's sword from 'Viking Boy' and are going to share these with the author Tony Bradman!
