In maths, we used different techniques to measure the playground and our classrooms.


Year 3

BRITISH SIGN LANGUAGE - FINGERSPELLING














































In geography we have been looking at maps and thinking of how we would plan journeys using maps and grid referencing.






In reading, year 5 have looked at the events in Viking Boy and predicted what father might do next.
