Year 2

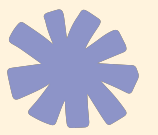
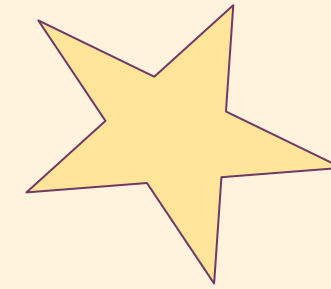

In science we carried out an experiment to see which type of fold on a paper would be the strongest. We used paper to build a 'bridge' and then put cubes on top to see how many it could hold.



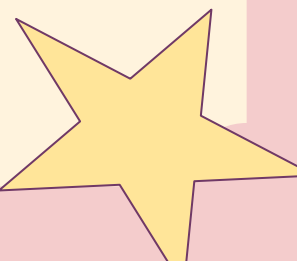
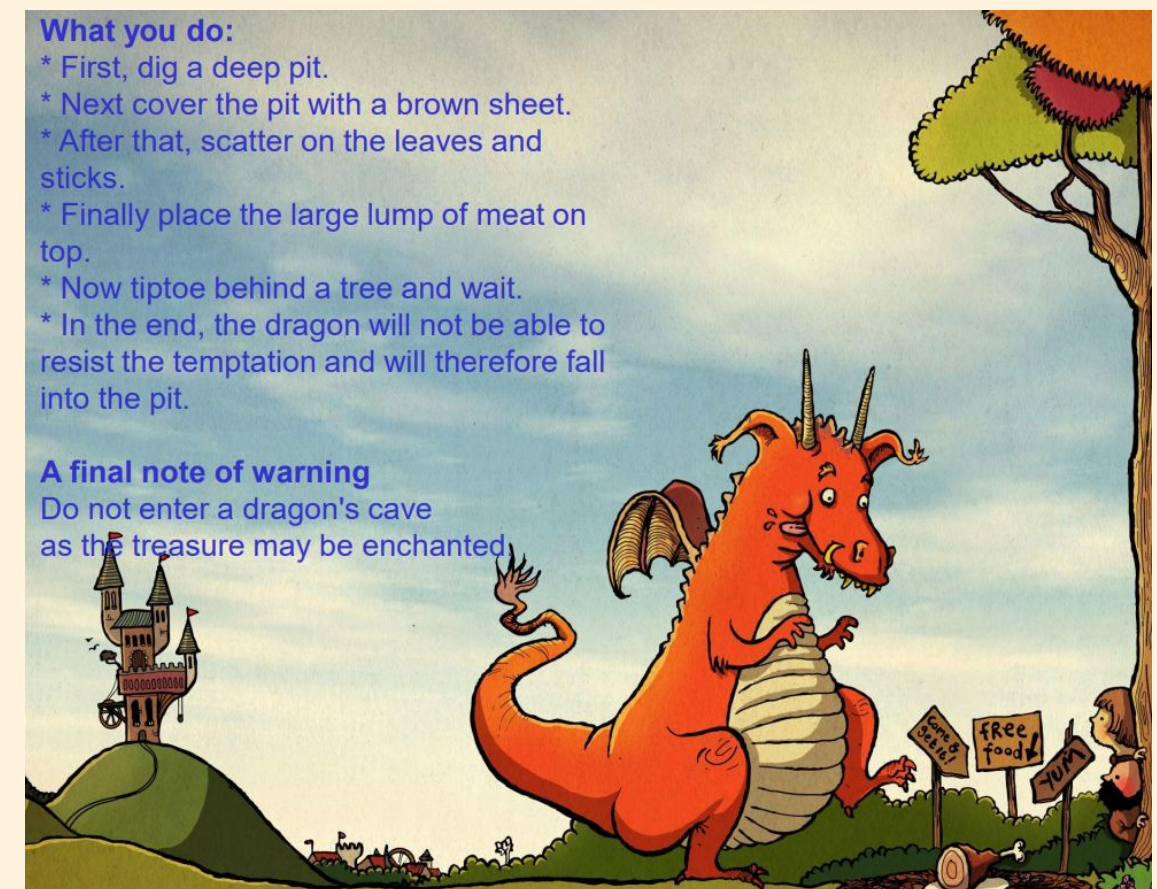
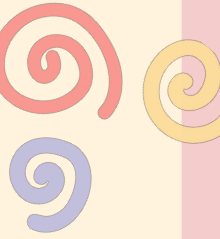
Year 3

We have read instructions about how to trap a dragon and we will write our own version to tell other people how to trap different creatures.

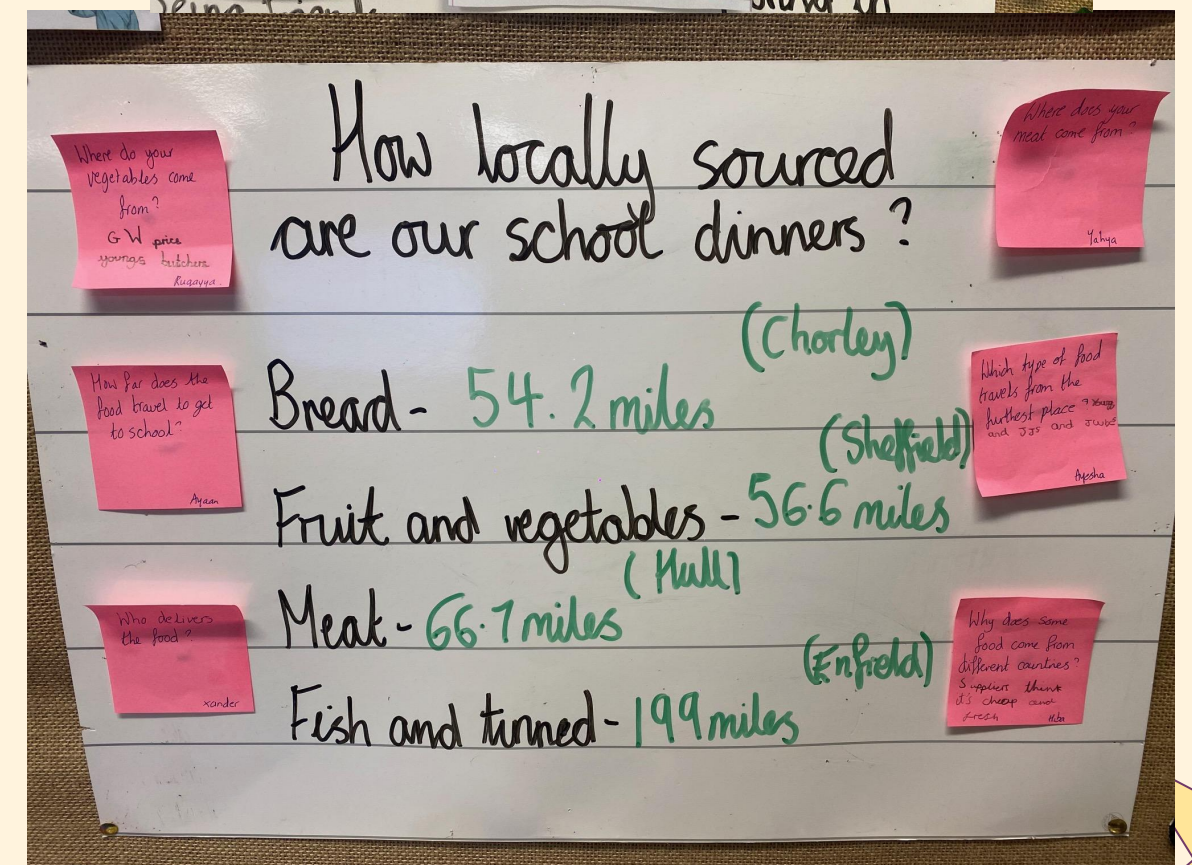
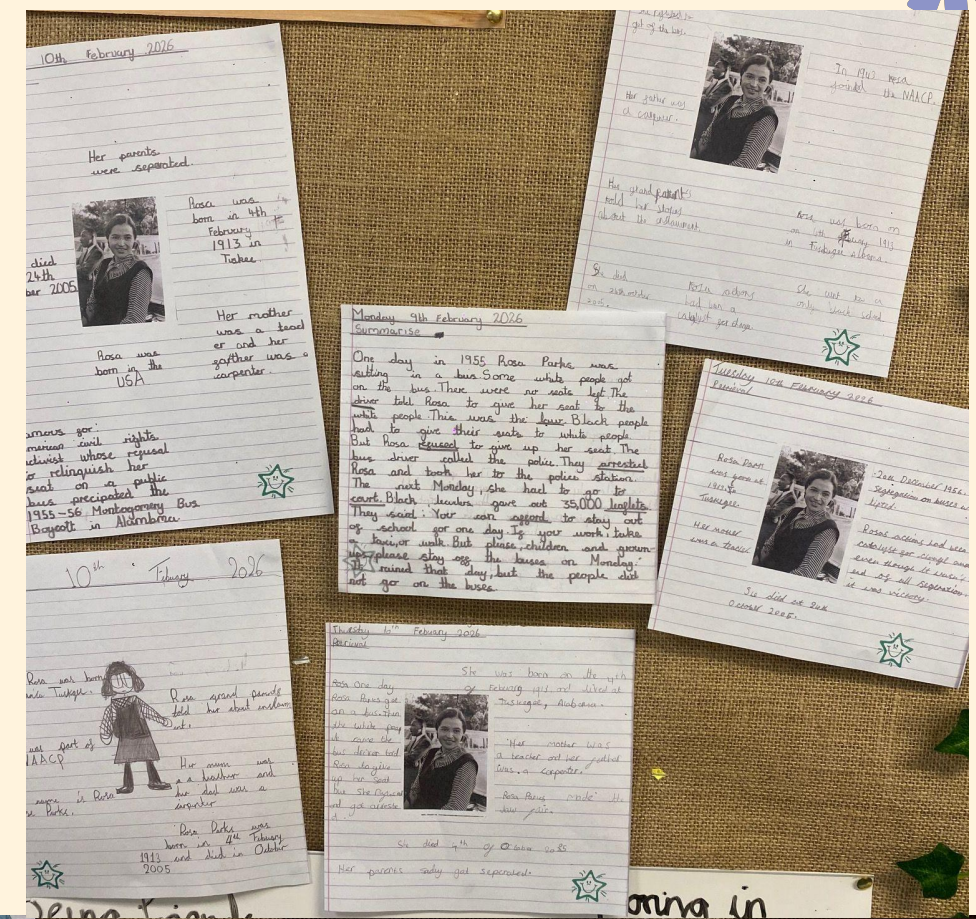
We have had lots of fun exploring magnets and have investigated which magnet is the strongest - we discovered it was a ring magnet.

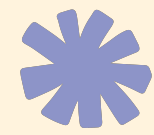


Year 4

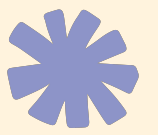
In reading we have been learning about Rosa Parks & Martin Luther King and how they were involved in improving how black people were treated in South Africa.

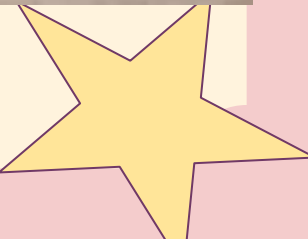
Year 5

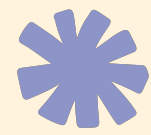

We have really enjoyed using gruesome words to engage the audience.

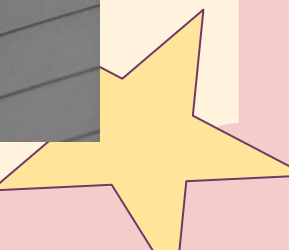
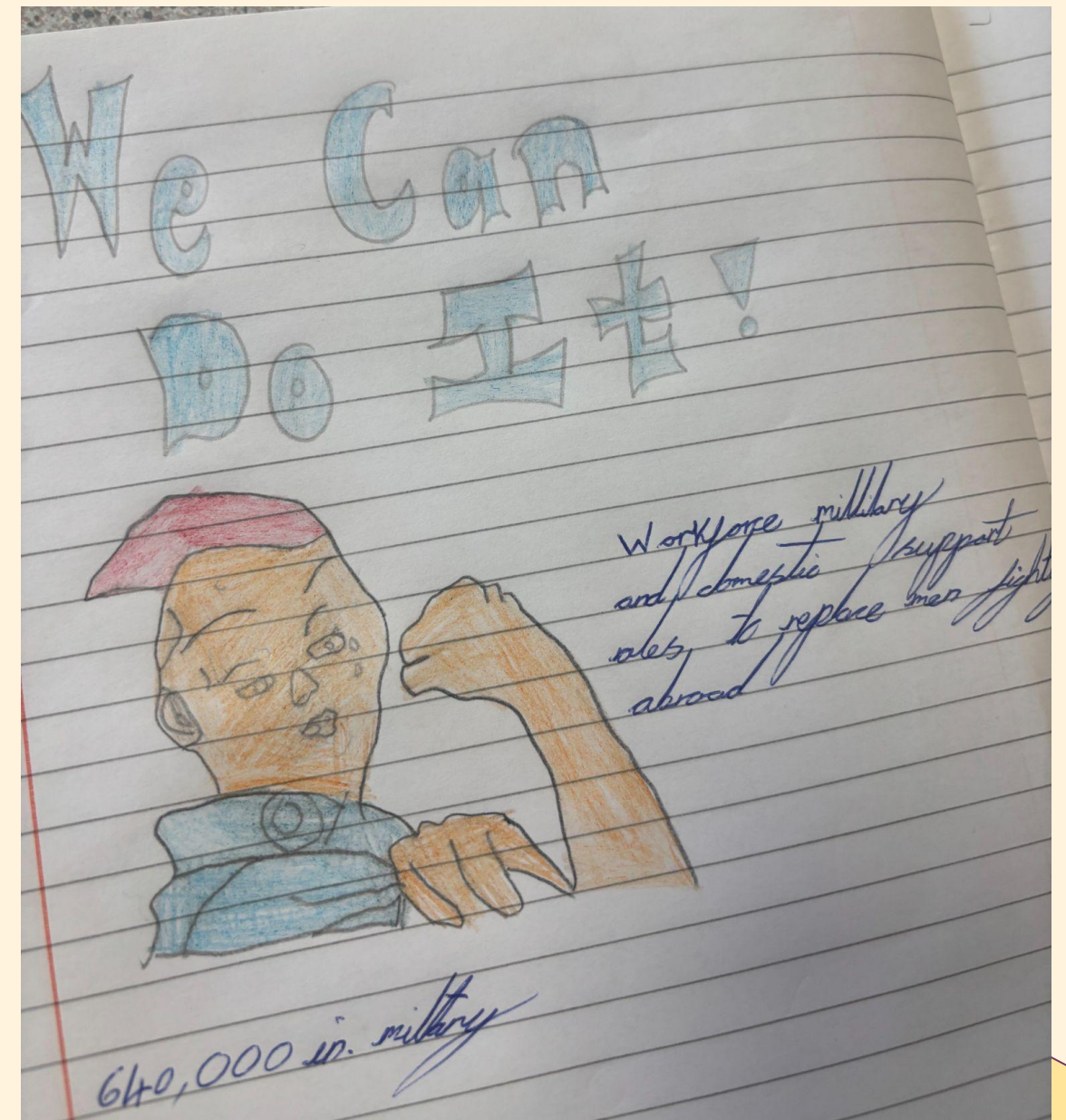




Year 6
