In nursery this week has been all about the food we eat and if it is healthy for us or not. We have been posting healthy food into the mouth box.



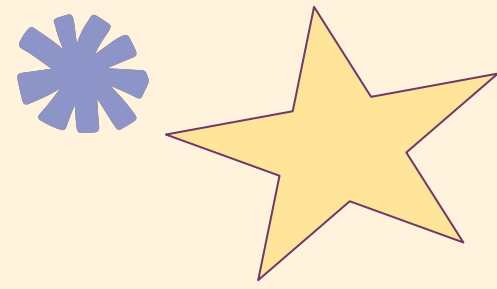

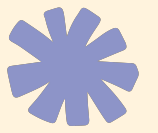
In maths, we have been exploring number blocks and practising how to order them correctly.

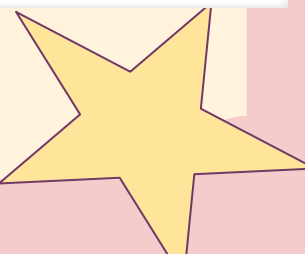
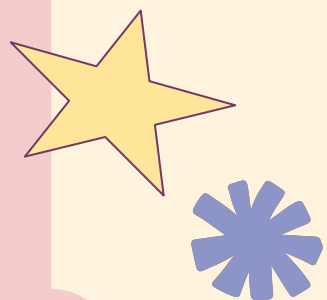
Year 1

In English we have been super busy retelling the story of 'on the way home'. Our teachers are very impressed with our writing and story retelling skills.

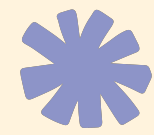


Year 2

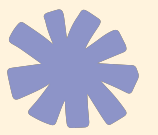
In English we have been looking at statements and using an apostrophe ready to plan our retell of 'Calvin Can't Fly'.

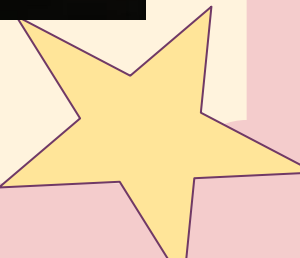
Year 3

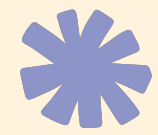

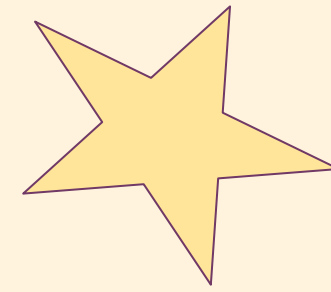
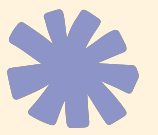
In maths, we have been using the grid method to multiply 2 and 3-digit numbers by a 1-digit number with exchange. We are becoming much more confident with this.

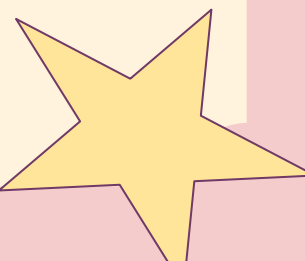
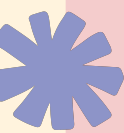
Year 4

We have also had the opportunity to take part in bikeability. We learnt to sit on a bike and ride it safely.

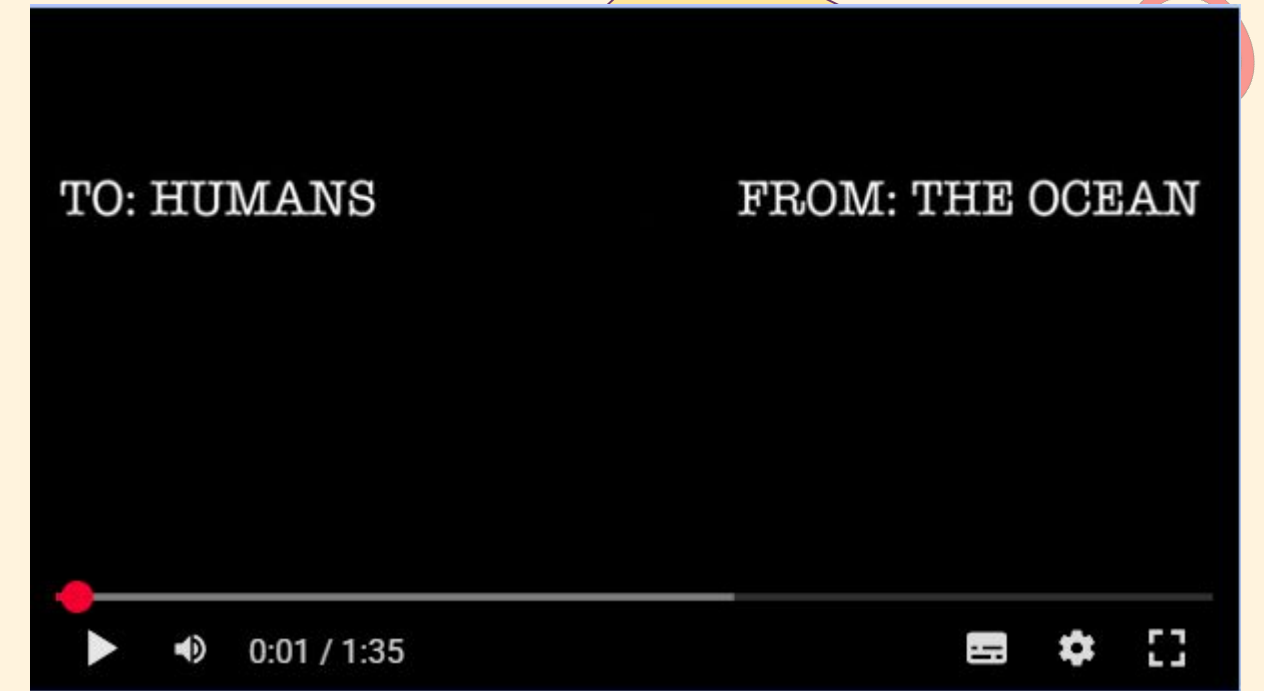


Year 6
