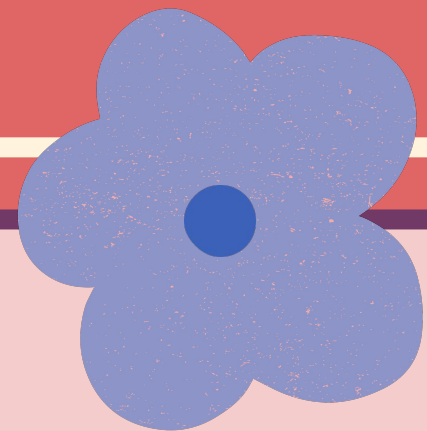

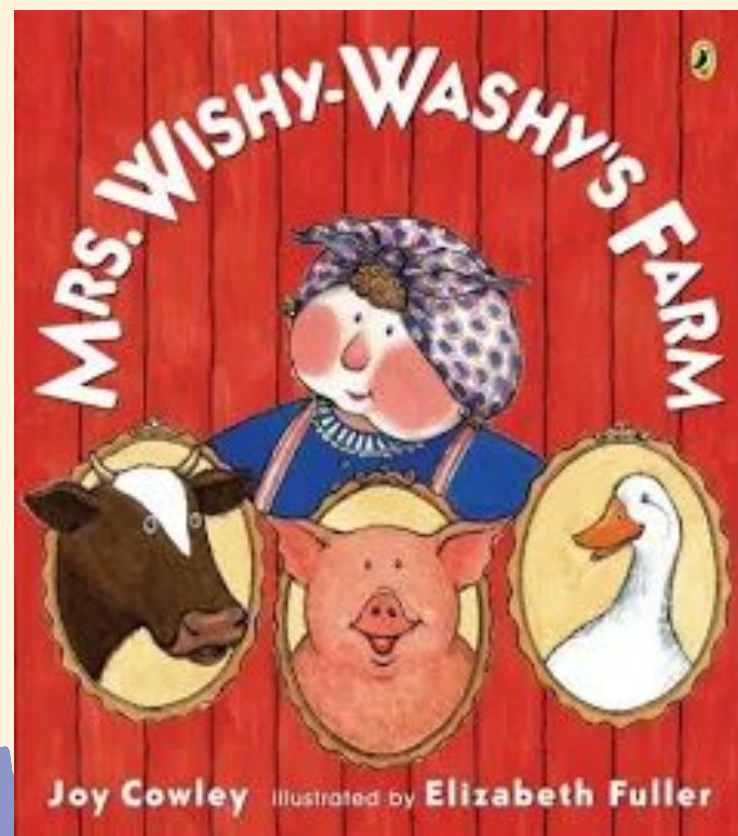

We all decided that we live in a city and its a good place to live.

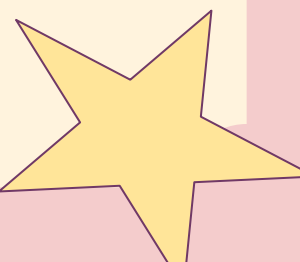
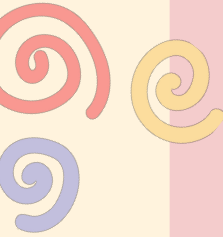
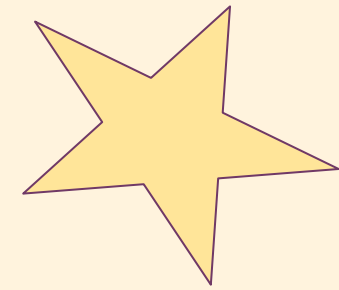
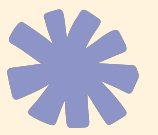


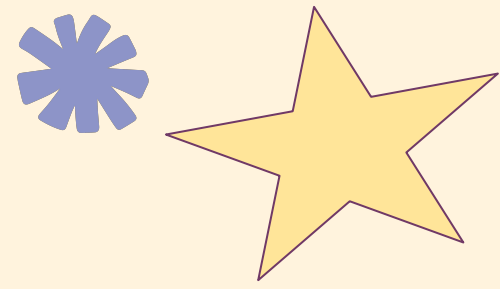
Reception

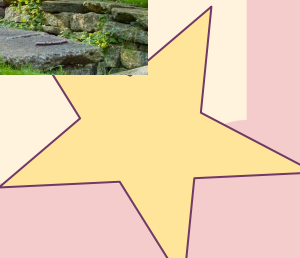
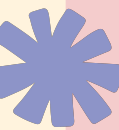
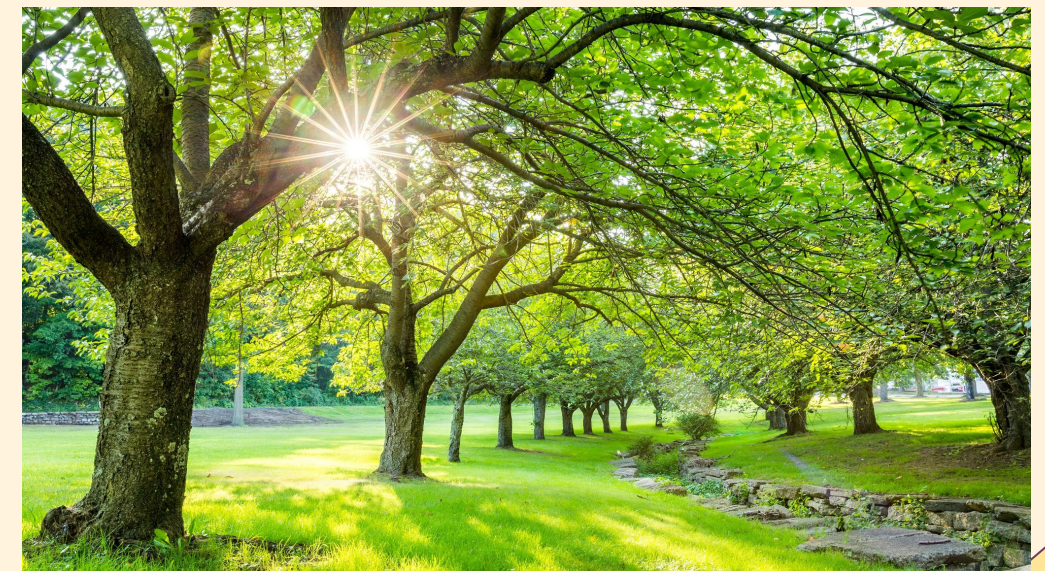


In English this week we have worked super hard to create our very own leaflets. They look amazing.

In geography we went on a walk around the school grounds looking for signs of the season.

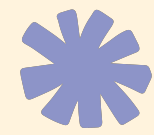


Year 2

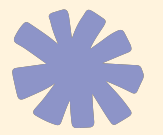
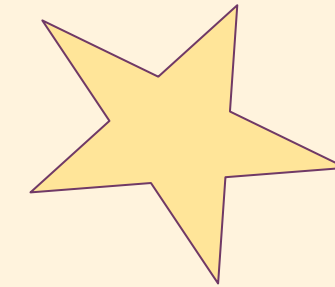
In English and maths we have been showing off everything we have learnt this year during our assessment week.

In DT we have been very creatively using cardboard boxes and tubes to make some fantastic castles!



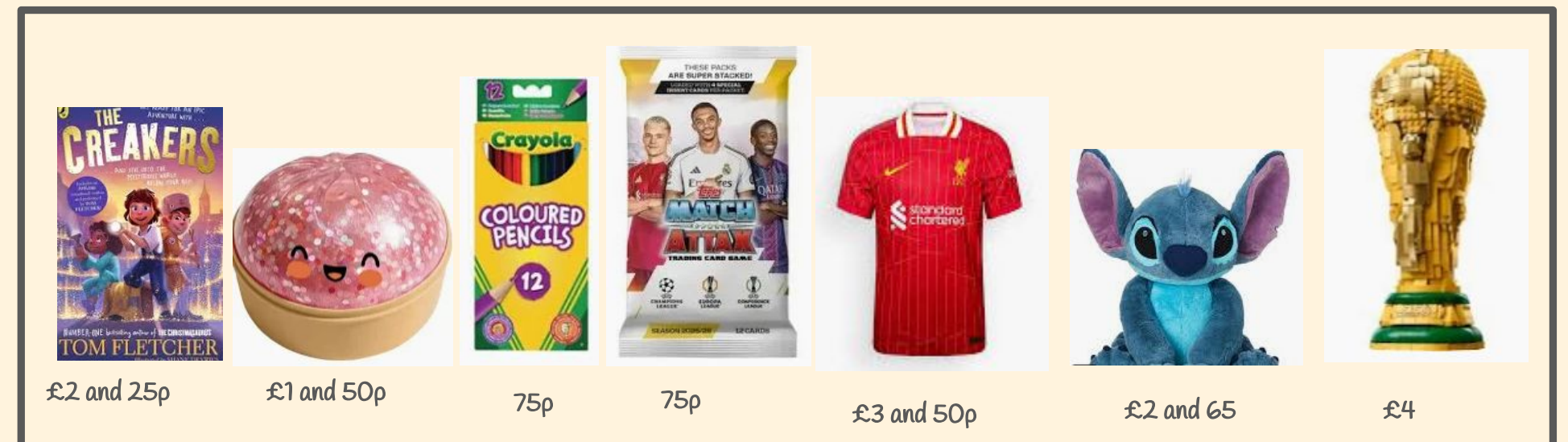


Year 3

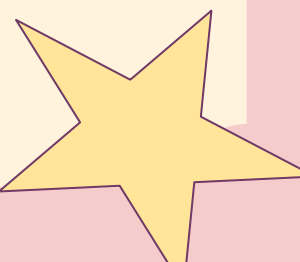

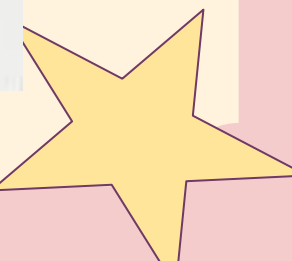
Year 5

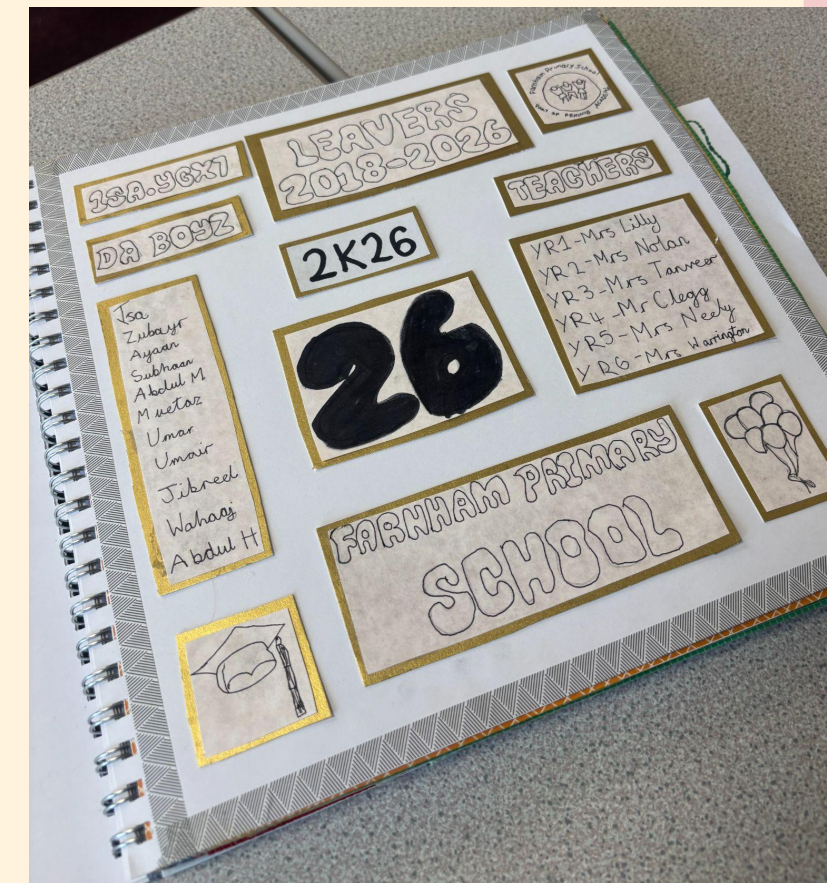
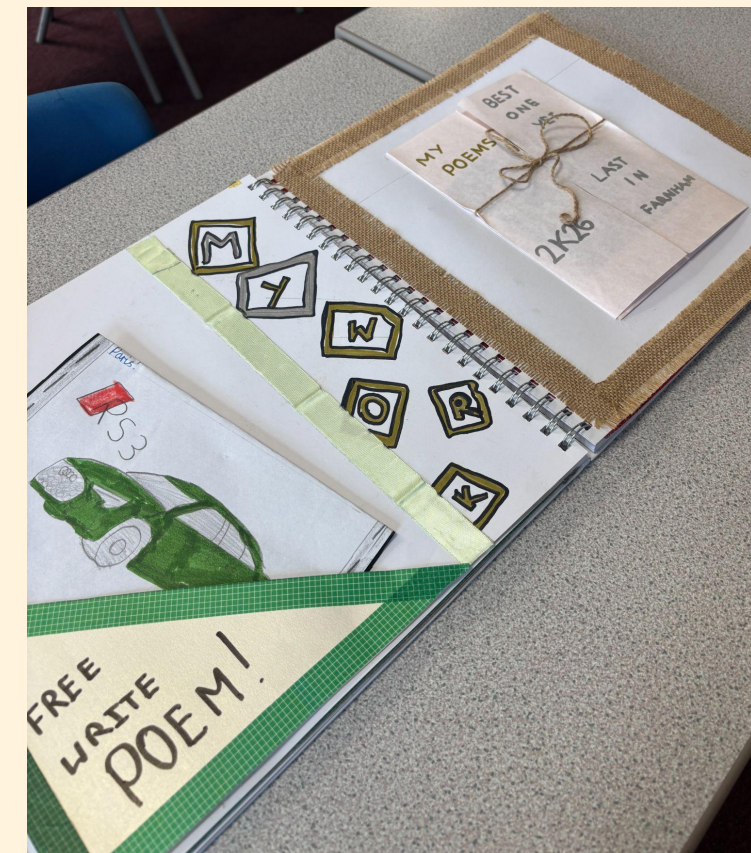
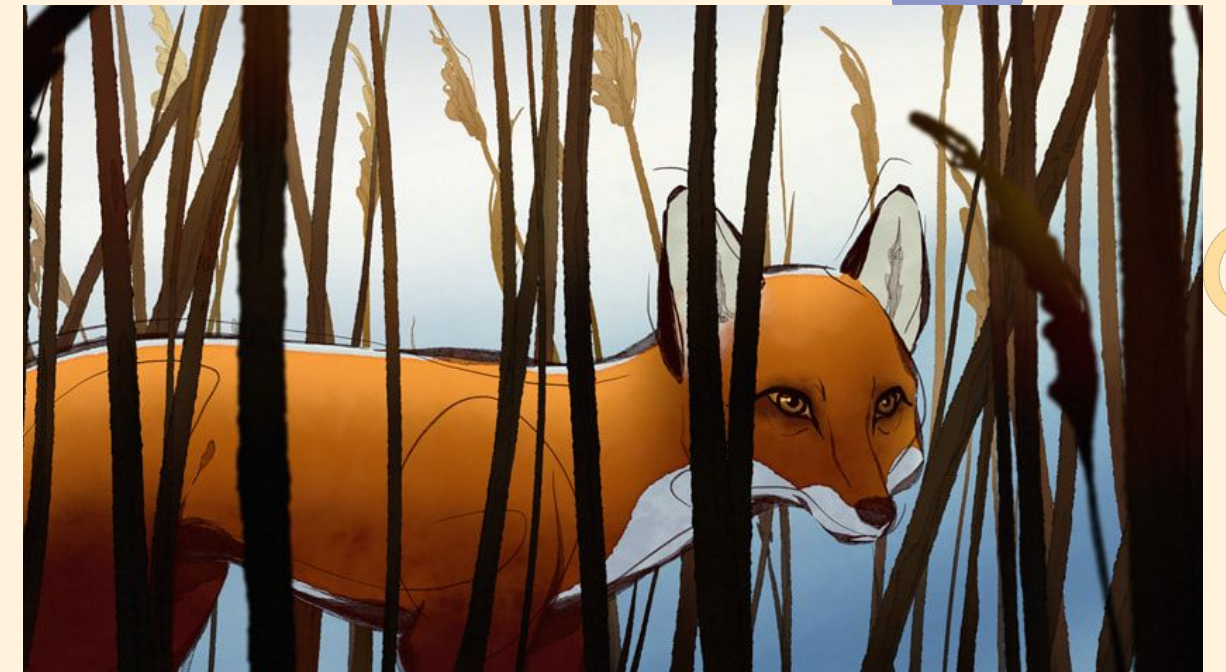


Year 6
